NSN(PG) College Lucknow, an associated college of Lucknow University adhered to the four-year undergraduate and two-year post graduate course structure, aligning with NEP-2020. With the vision of multi-disciplinary/interdisciplinary approach, the college has integrated humanities, science and commerce streams and began the under-graduate programs in the session 2022-23. The four-year UG course is divided into 8 semesters each having 24 credits with a total of 92 credits. There is an option for the student to take a break in studies and rejoin after a gap i.e., multiple entry and exit without time boundations. Keeping with the spirit of NEP, students opt for two major subjects and one minor subject. In addition to that they opt for a co-curricular/ Vocational paper which is interdisciplinary in nature. Hence the students are exposed to the interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary course pattern from the very beginning of the undergraduate course.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Higher Education Department of Uttar Pradesh Government developed a portal called Academic Bank for College and University Students (ABACUS) in order to store the academic credits earned by students digitally. Accordingly it is mandatory for all the faculty and students to join the ABACUS portal of ABC for smooth implementation of NEP-2020.

Our institute Nari Siksha Niketan P.G. College has successfully registered under ABC on Abacus portal. We have filled the data for human resource, staff, teaching, non-teaching, class-III and class-IV. Data for college infrastructure- faculties, class rooms, labs and other facilities like library, play ground etc. have also been uploaded. B.A., B.Com, B. Sc. students have registered themselves on the portal and they are in the way of filling more informations required on the portal. Thus we are continuously upgrading and uploading relevant data for the same.

All the credit earned by the students will also be deposited in their ABACUS account. In case the student get shifted to a different institution the accumulated credits will get transferred to the account of the new institution or other program in the same institution.

17. Skill development:

Opportunities for vocational education and training are critical

to the development of skills and employability of students. It helps prepare students for fulfilling careers by providing essential knowledge and experience that are advantageous in the interview selection processes. Practical training along with theoretical courses are an intrinsic part of our college curriculum, aiming to impart a holistic education and hone well-rounded individuals. With this belief and in an effort to ensure our students' success in the job market, the college facilitates all our enrolled students to opt for several vocational courses as per the University guidelines. Our courses a) Self Enhancement Skills b) Report Writing and Presentation Skills c) Counseling and Guidance - give the students an opportunity to gain practical experience in their field of interest before they finish graduation. These rigorous courses enable them to have an edge as they are confident in their skills, having gained simulated experience of the environment and tools wherein they will be working as employees. Soft skills training, as per the NEP 2020 guidelines, has been an integral part of all the vocational classes this year.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Lucknow University has introduced the new curriculum structure for four year undergraduate program as per the New Education Policy- 2020, which incorporates and moderates the education system and learning capabilities in new terms. These courses are incorporated in all the three faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. This NEP- 2020 system is introduced both Lucknow University and its constituent colleges, using bilingual form of teaching and evaluating both in Hindi and English, since its inception.

Time to time the college organizes programs for learning and promotion of Indian cultural, ethical and spiritual values among the students. Various programs have been conducted to introduce the students to cultural heritage and their importance in our nation. Facets of regional uniqueness, different languages, communal harmony and social and religious tolerance of our diverse Indian culture is introduced through the programs. Different glorious days along with National festivals like Holi Celebration, Eid Celebration, Independence Day, Republic Day,

Geeta Jayanti, Hindi Saptah etc. were organized to strengthen the unity and integrity of Nation.

To understand the Indian culture in terms of religious, and cultural background, college has organized many cultural programs in forms of nukkad natak and drama for awareness. Educational tours were also conducted by various departments of the college. Some of the programs are running under the initiatives of UP government like Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav which is a yearlong event, inculcating harmony and patriotism in the minds of the young generation and teaches the students to express gratitude to the untold sacrifices of freedom fighters of our Nation. Other than this college also conducts various programs such as World Environment Day, and awareness programs for Voting, traffic rules and the khelo India. The college also initiates online job-oriented program for students, for their future.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The NSN (PG) College follows the syllabus based on the NEP-2020 provided by Lucknow University. The University emphasizes on outcome-based education, which is reflected in curriculum design (NEP-2020), teaching-learning process and assessment. All courses have been designed keeping in mind the macro-economic and social needs of the students. Apart from it, learning outcomes also ensure social responsiveness, ethics, employability and entrepreneurial skills so that students can contribute proactively for the economic, environmental and social well-being of the nation. The institution focuses on teaching-learning with vocational and skill development courses incorporated in it. The faculty also provides e-books, e-contents, Youtube videos, for better understanding and also evaluates students in various ways like - projects, presentations, PDF, PPTs, Quiz, educational tours, seminars, webinars etc. As a part of NEP-2020 implementation, students are motivated to come to college regularly for their academic achievement as well as various other activities and use SWAYAM platform to enhance learning in various courses.

20.Distance education/online education:

The NEP 2020 placed emphasis on online education because it is well known that the current era is technology-driven, and our college is actively involved in developing ICT-enabled online learning.

Our faculty members employ a variety of digital platforms for teaching and learning, including LCD projectors and a variety of other devices to give online lectures via Wi-Fi access during classes, meetings, webinars, and conferences. Zoom, Google Meet, Google Classroom, Digital writing programmes like MS-Paint, OneNote, Presentation programmes like MS-Powerpoint, Google Slides, and others are just a few of the ICT tools used at NSN(PG) College.

Through a variety of simulation movies, the off-line laboratory skills are also digitally taught. Faculty members often encourage students to use Inflibnet to access a variety of Online Learning Platforms, including as MOOCs, SWAYAM, E-Pathshala, and other EJournals. Additionally, all of the pupils have made substantial use of Google Access's electronic resources, such as books, magazines, and other content.

The college follows Lucknow University's academic calendar. The academic calendar is displayed on the notice boards, communicated to the students through Whatsapp groups and uploaded on the college website.

The marks division is as follows-

- The theory exams held by the Lucknow University carries 75 marks (NEP).
- In the laboratory courses students submit their work/record files in their scheduled practical classes which are examined by the assigned faculty.

Practical exams conducted by the Lucknow University are held in the college. Within the stipulated time, the marks of internal assessment and practical examinations are uploaded on the Lucknow University portal. 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

An orientation program for all students is organized at the beginning of the session to bridge gaps and help familiarization, increase peer interaction along with an introduction to the faculty, courses, committees and other facilities. The varied cognitive and scholastic ability of students is then assessed based on their participation in class and other college activities, as well as performance in internal assessments. While the institution closely observes the students learning style, caution is taken in not labeling or creating any psychological division.

Advanced learners are further given all opportunities and tools to hone their abilities through challenging assignments and project works, extended library use, taking peer classes under observation, and assisting slow learners. They are also encouraged to participate in educational contests, seminars, competitive exams and are counseled for career possibilities.

Slow learners are given equal consideration to help enhance their abilities through compensatory and remedial teaching, peer tutoring by advanced learners, providing chances for classroom participation, varying instructional techniques, encouraging note taking, exploring the college library, and use of online resources for learning purposes.

The NEP 2020 enables students to enroll in vocational and co curricular studies for a well-rounded development while also helping them overcome their inhibitions and develop confidence.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Lectures are designed to facilitate student participation. Peer teaching sessions, quizzes, questioning and small group competitions are encouraged in class to facilitate the learning process. Hands-on experiences, reflections, reasoning and volunteer work are exercises frequently conducted by the faculty as well as NCC//NSS teams for enhanced understanding.

The institution has a dedicated Botanical garden maintained by students. They are also taken on field trips to various environmental events organized in the city. The zoology and botany departments actively encourage students to find and grow their own samples, like nest building/hunting, exploring and preserving live species of insects and annelids, etc. Faculty of theoretical subjects encourage practical application of theories and concepts to real world situations through day to day experiences and observations of the students. Students enthusiastically contribute personal creations like poetry and shortstories for the college magazine.

Several webinars and courses provide the students an opportunity to apply their learning and creativity to develop practical and effective solutions to real world problems. Critical thinking and group tasks are a part of the institutional curriculum to nurture socially conscious and resourceful individuals.

Traditional methods that facilitate memory building are intermixed with active learning methods to ensure cognitive excellence.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

ICT tools are readily used in the institution to provide the best possible exposure to the students. Library membership along with Infilbnet is made available to enhance information availability. The computer lab runs vocational courses for students. Various apps like Zoom and GoogleMeet are often used for webinars, presentations and guest lectures. LCD projector with mic and sound system is used for enhanced information delivery. Information sharing is also simplified with the use of WhatsApp and YouTube.

Students are encouraged to explore digital models for presentation and creative purposes, thereby enhancing their IT literacy. Educational films and other adaptations are often played for the students for better understanding of their course content. They are also given direct access links to the subject wise e-content available on the institutional and university websites as well as faculty Youtube channels. Use of laptops is encouraged among faculty to generate curiosity and interest among learners. The college has an easily accessible wi-fi network to facilitate teaching. Students are also motivated in the use of spreadsheets, pdfs and ppts for presentation and note taking purposes.

Guest lectures in English, Psychology and Physical Education were held during the session along with several webinars on Cyber Security & Awareness, Yoga, Blood Donation among others. Google form is also the preferred mode of feedback collection in the college.

The college ardently ensures a transparent and infallible examination conduction process at the end of each semester as per University norms and regulations. Internal Assessments along with examinations forms a complete mechanism for student evaluation, with marks distribution as follows : Internal Assessment (25 Marks) and Examination (75 Marks). The internal assessment marks allotment system is further divided into three parts of which projects/ assignments carry 10 marks; presentation/viva voce 10 marks; and class attendance 5 marks, together as such forming a total of 25 Marks. 1. Solid waste management: The college, campus, classrooms and library etc. are cleaned every day. For daily waste management, dustbins are kept on every floor for solid waste collection. The college has a compost pit for the recycling of garden waste. The waste generated in form of dry leaves and twigs from trees are collected in corner of the play field and sent to the primary collection center. College follows the practice of Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle (3Rs). College always triesto make students aware of the zero waste techniques and use of 3Rs. NSS Volunteers & NCC, cadets actively participate in the cleanliness activities.

2. Liquid waste management: The liquid waste generated from the chemistry lab is diluted 20 times before it is put in the sink. The use of Chromic and perchloric acid is banned in the lab, flame tests and semi-micro mixture analysis is used in conjunction with macro-analysis. There is fume chamber for storage of acids and carrying out polluting experiments. Phytoremediation has been used

to combat NO2 and SO2 gases when produced.

3. **Biomedical waste management:** College always organizes awareness regarding sanitary napkins and dispose of pads.

4. **E-waste management:** College is still trying to create awareness among students about E-Waste management.
